Hello Lions Bay,

Major surprises in the municipal elections. At rough count only 13 of 40 current Metro Board members were re-elected, and who knows if their all-changed Councils will reappoint them. There will be 17 newcomers to the 23 seats on Mayors' Council (which drives regional transit, increasingly important to Lions Bay. A lot of corporate knowledge is walking out the door. I know people believe Mayor or Councillor is but a ceremonial, hobby-type pursuit, but in fact even little Lions Bay's Council has strategic import regionally. Municipally, with our new mayor and councillors all having been acclaimed, turnout in our curtailed election for school board alone was a poor 17% or so of 1000 voters. Lions Bay's incumbent Pieter Dorman was not reelected. I fear the part of the community that sees value in keeping our K-3 school open will come to regret Pieter's absence.

It's my second-last missive. For next week, I'm preparing a **State Of The Village** report.

With a one-year term behind me and a subsequent acclamation for 2018 - 2022, I hope to shed some light on why I am back in the fray.


