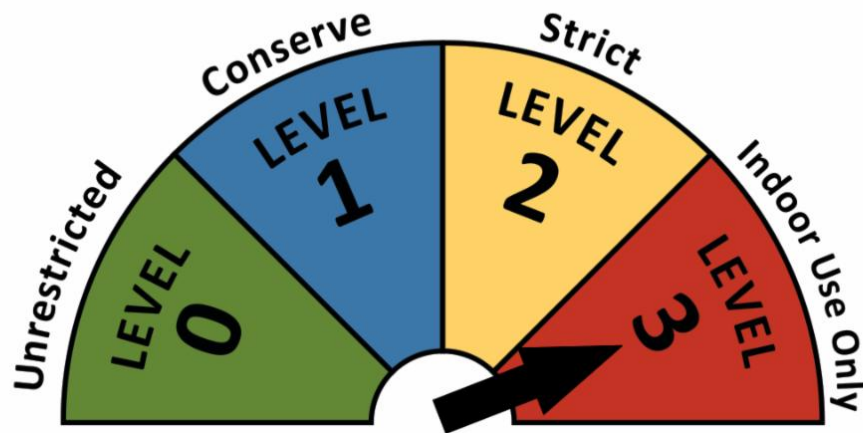

LEVEL 3 WATER CONSERVATION ENACTED



Level 3 Water Conservation Measures Begin at Midnight, August 28, 2019

Due to the continuing dry weather and diminishing creek supply, the Municipality is enacting Water Conservation Level 3 as of midnight tonight. Our heartfelt thanks go out to all those who've assisted by cutting back on outdoor water use to date – it has helped. Unfortunately, without any significant precipitation forecast for the next two weeks it is necessary to further restrict outdoor water use by moving to Conservation Level 3.

NO OUTDOOR WATER USE IS PERMITTED

Under Water Conservation Level 3, all outdoor water use (with very few exceptions) is banned. For details please see the [Outdoor Water Use Conservation Measures Chart](#) in the "Village of Lions Bay Outdoor Water Use Bylaw 484, 2015.

NOTICE OF FIRE HAZARD LEVEL INCREASE TO “HIGH”

The Lower Fraser Basin, which includes Lions Bay, remains “very dry” on the B.C. Drought Map. To view the Drought Map visit the [British Columbia Drought Information Portal](#) and click on the BC Drought Map tab. With warm temperatures and no significant precipitation forecast through the next two weeks of summer, the fire hazard rating in the Village of Lions Bay has moved to “High”. Please ensure that you are cautious using tools and refrain from using those that may cause sparks, such as chain saws, particularly in the afternoons. No campfires are permitted in Lions Bay - report any fires to 911.
