## Updates from the Municipality

**ATTENTION LIONS BAY  
RESIDENTS - PAVING  
SCHEDULED FOR NEXT WEEK**

**OCTOBER 5 - 9**

BA Blacktop will begin paving operations in Lions Bay on Monday, October 5, 2020. Crews will work between 7:30am and 5:30pm from Monday to Friday as they strive to complete our outstanding paving lists. Please note that the dates may shift slightly if there is inclement paving weather or other mitigating factors.

Please see the [attached paving map](#) for details on the areas being paved. Residents can expect construction crews, paving and grinding equipment and loud grinding noises in the two main areas of complete restoration:

1. Between 450 and 500 Upper Bayview, and
2. Between 75 and 135 Tidewater Way.

This portion of the work will involve grinding the whole road width and overlaying the area with new asphalt. Just prior to the asphalt being put down, a layer of oil will be sprayed on the road. Please use caution and avoid driving oil onto your driveways during this stage of construction (usually around 1 to 2 hours prior to paving).

**Traffic control personnel will be present to direct vehicles and pedestrians safely.**

### TRAFFIC/PARKING IMPACTS

No Roadside Parking will be allowed in the two main areas identified above and temporary no parking signage will be installed as a reminder. Please note there will be delays with accessing or exiting driveways during construction activities – please plan ahead. To enable the work to proceed as efficiently as possible, we ask that you refrain from parking along the aforementioned sections of roadway during construction and ask that you ***park your vehicle(s) wholly on your driveway or outside the paving areas.***

The top layer of asphalt is scheduled to be placed starting on Tuesday, October 6,

2020 for Upper Bayview and Wednesday October 7, 2020 for Tidewater Way. Shortly after the asphalt has been placed and given time to cool, that section of the road will be reopened to **LOCAL TRAFFIC ONLY** if you need to leave your home, please ensure your vehicle is out of the area before 7:00 am. Please note that access to driveways cannot be guaranteed once the paving operation has begun.

**Residents and motorists are reminded to please exercise caution while driving in and around the construction areas.**

We understand that the above restrictions will cause inconveniences and we apologise in advance for this. If you require any extra assistance or need to let us know of a particular consideration, please do not hesitate to email [works@lionsbay.ca](mailto:works@lionsbay.ca).

**Although not anticipated, in the event of rain, the project may have to be postponed until a later date, in which case you will be notified again.**



On **Tuesday, October 6, 2020**, Scottish Line Painting will be back in the Village to paint long lines. Long lines are what the industry refers to as centre lines and fog lines (the white lines at the edges of the roads). In an attempt to fit us into their buys schedule, Scottish will begin painting in the late afternoon and continue on into the early evening. Please note there may be minor traffic interruptions in some areas as needed – crews ask that you slow down and stay well behind the line painting truck. Also, be patient and obey the instructions of any line painting personnel or traffic control personnel.

#### **Line Painting Facts:**

- It takes approximately 3 minutes for traffic paint to dry;
- Wet traffic paint on the road may splatter on your vehicle if you cross the line before the paint has dried;
- If your vehicle is splattered with paint, go to a car wash as soon as possible;
- If paint does not wash off, spray the affected area with WD-40 and allow it to dry for 2 hours, then re-wash the affected area;
- If the paint remains, consider submitting a claim to your insurer.

**The Village of Lions Bay will not be liable for claims for road paint overspray onto adjacent cars parked within any Temporary No Parking areas or claims from motorists who cross wet paint lines.**

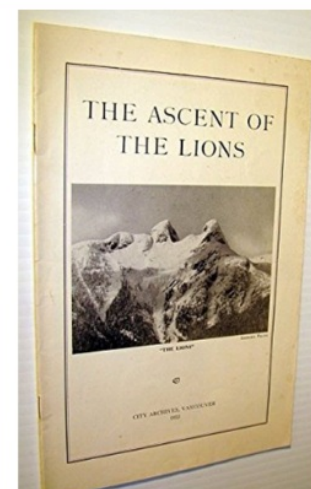
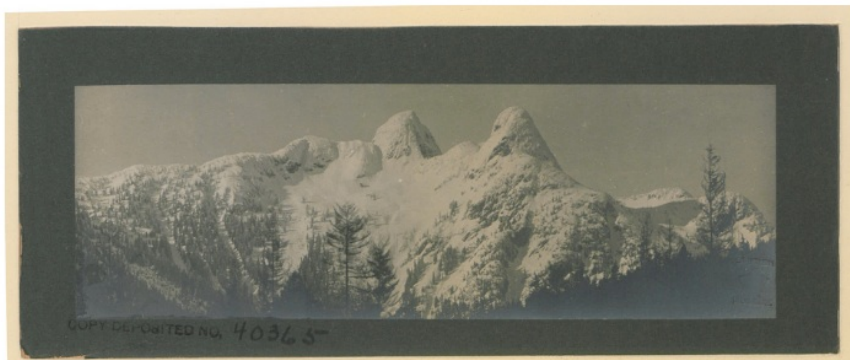

## LIONS BAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY "LOOKING BACK"

### THE ASCENT OF THE LIONS

Throughout history, Ch'ich'iyuy Elxwikn, (the Two Sisters), also known as the Lions, has been the source of legend for the Coast Salish people and revered by many hikers.

The mountain peaks sit on the traditional territory of the Squamish, Tsleil-Waututh, and Musqueam Nations and have been mentioned in history books for a long time. Curiosity and beauty has attracted teams of hikers that have taken different routes to reach the Lions.

The first documented ascent to the Lions was in 1889 with H.O. Bell-Irving, Chief Joe Capilano and a group of Squamish men who were on a hunting trip. They followed a herd of wild goats and reached the peak of the West Lion.

The hiking party that followed consisted of Atwel King, George Martin and Arthur Dolton. They reached the West Lion on August 11, 1903. To symbolize this victory, they flew a small Union Jack from its peak.

The same year in September the Latta brothers, William, John and Robert, started their long hike from Vancouver on Saturday, September 5, 1903 to the West Lion. The first time the Lions Bay flag flew on the West Lion was on Saturday, July 27th 1996. More recently, on Saturday, September 19, 2020, our LBFR Team turned up in numbers to hike to the West Lion in full gear. Their aim was to raise funds for Muscular Dystrophy. It was a proud day for our Village. Congratulations to the committed and amazing LBFR team and their water carriers. The Lions Bay flag was seen once again on the West Lion.
