

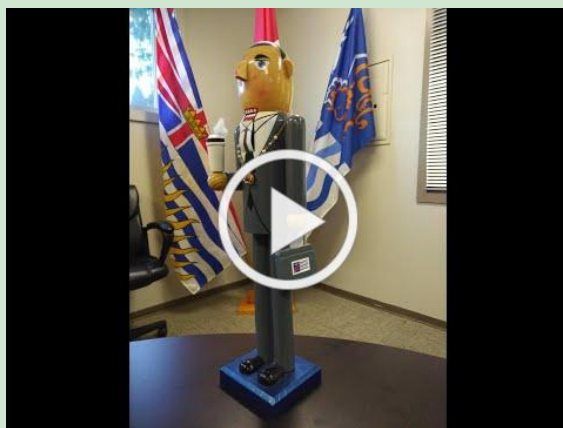

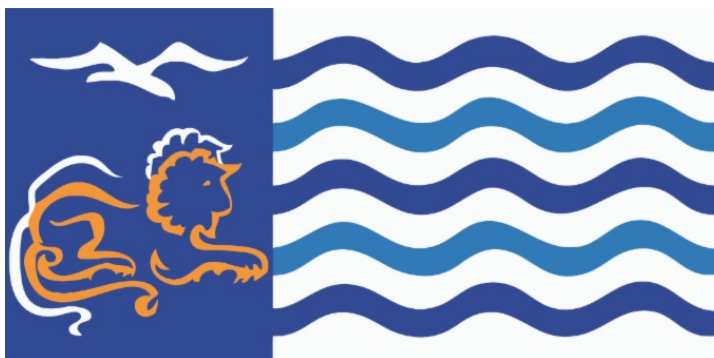

Santa joined the Lions Bay Fire Department for a COVID-friendly Christmas.

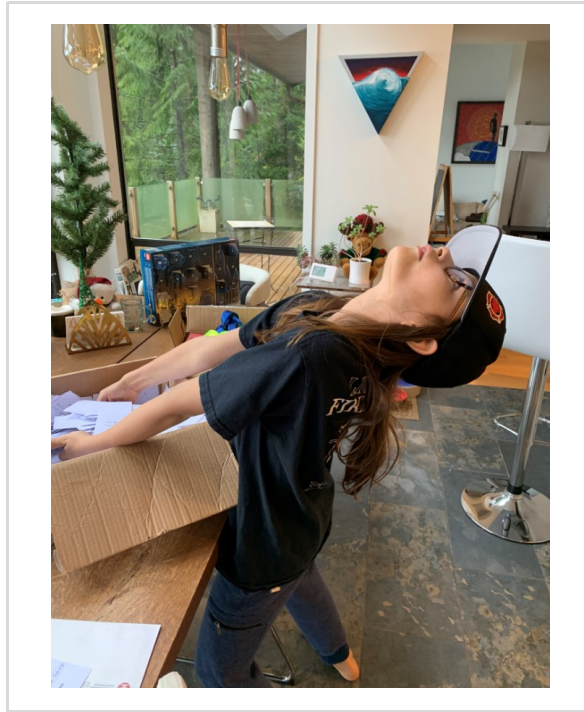


Santa visited with local kids and took photos and raised funds for the preschool and Fire Department.

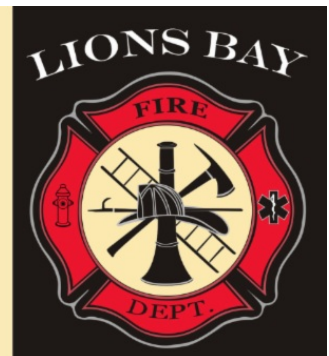

Don't Blast Unless you Ask!

As we approach the New Year, Village staff would like to remind you of the Village of Lions Bay Consumer Fireworks Policy.

The [Fire Bylaw](#) bans the use of High Hazard Fireworks within the Village. It does allow the use of Consumer Fireworks, with a one week notice and approval from the Fire Chief, under the following conditions:

Policy: Residents may use Consumer Fireworks on October 31 and New Year's Eve of any year, but not Canada Day because of the high risk at that time. They must give the Village Office notice one week in advance. The notice given to the Village Office must include the time, place and type of fireworks to be involved, who is to handle them and set them off and contact information for that person. This will allow time for the Fire Chief to conduct an inspection as he deems necessary of where and how the fireworks are to be let off.

The fireworks may then only be used if the Fire Chief is satisfied that they:

- a. May be discharged without creating a risk of fire or injury;
- b. May be discharged without being propelled at any building, structure, hedge or vegetation;
- c. Will not be discharged within 30 metres of any location where flammable materials are stored;
- d. Are not High Hazard fireworks;
- e. Are not Movie Pyrotechnics, which are addressed under the Village of Lions Bay Filming Policy.

Transit Service Changes

Starting January 4, 2021

TransLink makes transit service changes every April, June, September, and January to reflect seasonal changes in demand and deliver more service to help customers get around the region. On January 4, 2021, service is being reallocated to the bus routes that need it the most. Highlights of the Winter Service Change include:
