On Tuesday, January 12<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m., the Council Strategy Committee (CSC) will receive a draft presentation on the updated Asset Management Investment Plan (AMIP) and engage in discussion on the information and the options outlined.

This is a cornerstone document for the Village of Lions Bay which will help inform decision-making on the management of the community's infrastructure and tangible capital assets. The AMIP will help Council identify the annual sustainable funding levels needed to ensure that Village assets continue to provide a high level of service in the future and that the Municipality has sufficient reserves for asset replacements when required.

Residents are invited to attend the CSC meeting to learn more about the AMIP and the important issues to be addressed through the upcoming budget, the 5 Year Financial Plan and future planning for the community to ensure its long-term financial sustainability.

## **REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS TO SIT ON THE CURLY STEWART MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AWARD COMMITTEE**

The Curly Stewart Memorial Trust Fund was established to honour the life and public service of the first mayor of the Village of Lions Bay, Allan M. “Curly” Stewart, who served from 1971 to 1981. A \$500 scholarship is awarded from the trust fund annually to a secondary student resident in Lions Bay who best exemplifies the qualities described in the terms of reference for the award.

The Curly Stewart Memorial Trust Fund Award Committee reviews applications and makes award recommendations to Council. Deliberations of the Committee are confidential in accordance with the provisions of the *Community Charter*, which allows closing such meetings to the public if the subject matter being considered relates to prescribed grounds including “personal information about an identifiable individual who is being considered for a municipal award or honour.”

The Committee has an opening for a new member. Familiarity with the ideals of educational aspirations, community service, citizenship, arts, athletics and an ability to consider applications intended to illustrate these ideals would be an asset.

Participation is in a volunteer capacity, with no remuneration offered. Level of effort is anticipated to be two to four two-hour meetings in the Spring, plus individual time to review applications. **Low intensity group exercise**

Businesses, recreation centres or other organizations that organize or operate low intensity group fitness activities may resume activities providing they follow the guidelines.

Health authority approval to re-open is not required but safety inspections continue regularly. Low intensity group exercise does not cause a sustained and accelerated rate of breathing and does not involve close contact with other people. These include:
  - Yoga (Hatha), Low intensity exercise machines and cardio equipment, Pilates, Light weightlifting, Stretching, Tai-Chi, Low intensity Barre classes
