Madison's Message to Lions Bay Residents below:





Our water use can increase by 50% in summer and the ongoing heat wave just exacerbates drinking water use, largely due to lawn watering. Please consider the following water-wise lawn care facts and help conserve our drinking water:

- Lawns need as little as 2 cm of water a week to stay healthy (i.e. maintain a strong root system). That's the equivalent of one hour a week of rainfall or sprinkling. Using too much water leaches nutrients from your lawn, promotes shallow rooting, and contributes to build up of thatch.
- Water in the early morning! Set your sprinkler timer to come on for 1 hour once a week between 4:00 am and 9:00 am (Mondays for even addresses and Thursdays for odd addresses). Watering in the early morning hours is the law under the Outdoor Water Use Conservation Bylaw and ensures all the water goes towards your lawn's growth rather than being lost to evaporation.
- Set your mowing height to 5-6 cm. This helps your lawn develop deep roots and dense, healthy growth that crowds out weeds. Taller grass keeps roots

shaded and better able to hold water.

NOTICE OF FIRE HAZARD LEVEL INCREASE TO "HIGH" AND CAMPFIRE BAN

The recent/on-going extreme heat event has allowed for the threat of wildfires in BC to increase. Wildfire ignitions are more likely now due to human-caused fires. Temperatures will remain 5-10 degrees above normal in the wake of the extreme heat event. As a result, the BC Wildfire Service has increased the rating for the Coastal Zone to High and will follow that up with a province-wide campfire ban beginning at noon, Wednesday, June 30, 2021. To keep up to date on the current fire ratings visit the Provincial Wildfire Activity site and to view the current bans and restrictions visit Fire Bans and Restrictions page.

In addition to the open fire and campfire bans, the Municipality would like to remind all residents and contractors of the fire causing potential of high-risk activities that may cause sparks such as:

- Excavating
- Drilling
- Grinding
- Hot works such as welding

- Mechanical Brushing or Land Clearing
- Trenching
- Using Fire or Spark Producing Tools, including chainsaws, angle grinders, and cutting tools
- Using or Preparing Fireworks or Pyrotechnics

Please ensure you or your contractors are extra vigilant during this period of extreme heat, curtail activity after 1 pm, have fire suppression supplies on hand and implement a two-hour post-construction activity fire watch where conditions warrant.

Haven't claimed your 2021 home owner grant? Claim now online before your taxes are due (July 14, 2021) at gov.bc.ca/homeowner grant

As previously communicated, municipalities will no longer be accepting applications for home owner grants (HOG's). All applications must now be made through the Province. In order to claim your HOG on-line with the Province, you will need the Village's jurisdiction number (537) and your roll number in the BC Assessment format which can be found on the BC Assessment website https://www.bcassessment.ca/Property/AssessmentSearch.

You can also search for your property using your civic address - please use the civic address as shown on your property tax notice.

Property Tax Deferrals

For those homeowners who defer their property taxes with the Province, please ensure that you do not have any **property taxes in arrears** (this information can be found on your Tax Notice).

Taxes in arrears must be paid in full before you can defer your property taxes; your deferral application will be rejected by the Province if you have taxes in arrears.

What's Happening in Lions Bay




Saturday July 3, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. our own team member Joel@allarms7

CN Police has new signs!

CN Police has made new heavy duty signage to post along the tracks at problem areas along the network, including the crossing that accesses the cliff jumping site.

Trespassing along railway tracks is a Federal offense that pertains to the Railway Safety Act, Section 26.1. Anyone caught trespassing may be subject to a \$575 fine. Any repeat offenders may be criminally charged or arrested.
