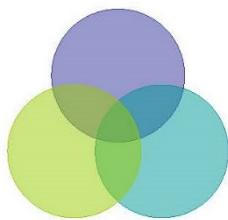
VOTING DAY NOVEMBER 19, 2016

SUPER MOON AND KING TIDES EXPECTED NEXT WEEK

On November 14th Mother Nature will provide an extraordinary display as the moon will make its closest pass to Earth since January 1948. This "super moon" is going to appear about 14% bigger and 30% brighter than a normal full moon.

Seasonal King Tides are expected to coincide with the super moon resulting in high water levels approaching 5 meters or 16.4 feet between November 15th and 19th. Winter King Tides are extreme high-tide events that occur when the Sun and Moon's gravitation forces reinforce one another at times of the year when the Moon is closest to the Earth.

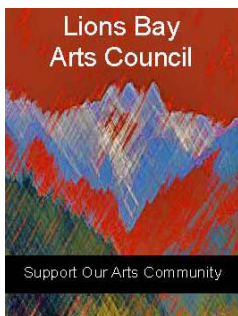
2017 MUNICIPAL GRANT APPLICATIONS
