From the Mayor's Desk

Hello Lions Bay,

Technical problems held up last week's Village Update, but here it is now. Congratulations to forthcoming Councillor Eileen Wilke on winning last week's by-election with 57 percent of 411 votes cast. The inauguration is Dec. 6, and I know I speak for Council and staff when I say we very much look forward to Eileen's contribution over the next two years: there's a lot on the go in Lions Bay Council.

And thank you for a landslide 93 percent assent to our \$3 mil. Loan Authorisation referendum. I take that as a mandate, and again Lions Bay demonstrates its secret weapon: we may be underfunded and downloaded-upon, but we are engaged and informed. My fellow mayors at GVRD shake their heads in admiration at a 40 percent turnout for a mid-term by-election and referendum: turnout for West Van's by-election the same day was 17.5 percent. Although their election had 12 candidates for one seat, so there must be something going on in West Van.
