JANUARY 16TH AND 17TH



Please be advised that BC Hydro requires two outages on January 16th and January 17th (approximately 30 minutes and 15 minutes respectively) to safely replace damaged switches at the Lions Bay substation. These outages will occur from 9-9:30 am on January 16th and 4-4:15 pm on January 17th. BC Hydro has notified affected residents by phone (dates were changed from the 8th and 9th). The Village Office will have no access to phones or internet during the indicated times.



CHRISTMAS TREE CHIPPING

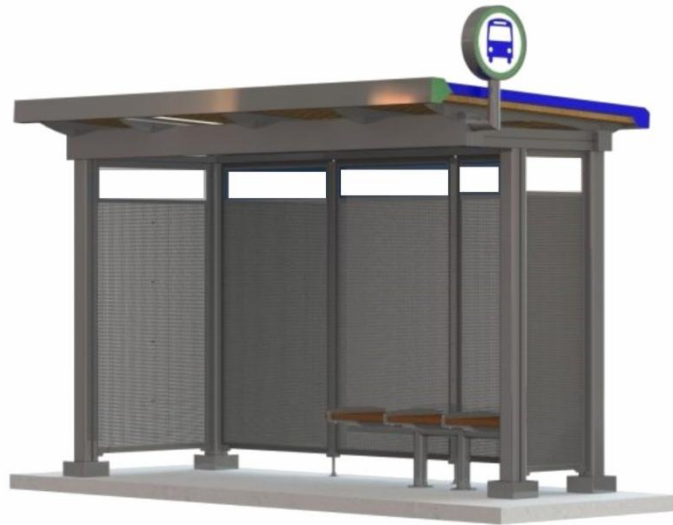
Public Works will be chipping resident Christmas trees on **Thursday, January 11, 2018**. Residents are encouraged to drop their trees off at the far end (southern end) of the CN Rail parking lot between December 29, 2017 and January 10, 2018.

The service is free and only available to residents of Lions Bay. Trees must be stripped of all ornaments and hangings and be free of any metal objects.

Please note, Christmas trees will not be accepted in your organics pick-up by Waste Control Services unless the wood and branches are cut up into pieces smaller than 3ft x 3in.

DID YOU KNOW - Christmas lights can be recycled, too! Light strings beyond repair can be dropped off at the Waste Control Services North Vancouver depot at 1493 Dominion Street.

NEW BUS SHELTER INSTALLED



Please note the new bus shelter has been installed on Crosscreek Road outside of the Village Office and Broughton Hall, 50 meters down from the prior bus stop. The new shelter and bus stop is now in use, although a few finishing touches are still to be completed, such as installation of the bench next week.

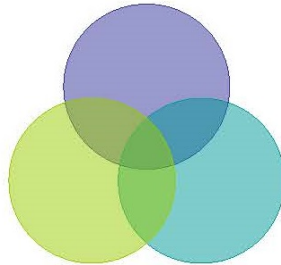
MANAGING RESIDENTIAL WOOD SMOKE IN METRO VANCOUVER
