From the Mayor's Desk

Hello Lions Bay,

You may notice our bus stop signs being tweaked next week to reflect what buses actually happen there. Yes, in Lions Bay the mayor reviews bus stop signage, because the goal is ultimately to get more Lions Bayers using our buses. How does one know the places one can go? Smartphoners can go to <https://nb.translink.ca/> and input the route number (ours are C12 and 259) to see their real-time locations. More steam-driven mobiles can text the bus stop number they're at and the bus route to 33333 (example: 54783 259) and within seconds, receive real-time information for the next two departure times. Text messaging rates apply. They made me say that.

And, register to receive alerts via SMS or email at the following link: <https://www.translink.ca/Profile/Register.aspx>; alerts can be customized to particular routes and days of the week, so customers only receive information that is relevant to them. By the way, our own C12 is soon changing to a new number, 262, for "system functionality reasons." Same bus, same schedule, same route, different number.

A worrisome spate of deliberately-set fires in the Village this week, including two where they took the trouble to drag in half a dozen tires to set alight, and one behind the gates at the Brunswick Hill fire training facility. The classroom trailer there burned down last year under suspicious circls. We're a Blockwatch community, so please keep an eye open and call the police for actions untoward--we cannot afford to have fires anywhere in the open, starting pretty much now, nor to lose our brand

new training trailer, nor to have mischief-makers hurt in our dangerous-by-design state-of-the-art burn building. Some cloud-connected surveillance cameras are going to have to go up, because we can't have some \$h!t-for-brains messing with Lions Bay. Did I get the expurgation right there?

A bit more on the trees removed from Lions Bay Beach. We expect a full prognosis report at Tuesday's Council meeting, but staff have already told us that the fellers report the tops of the trees were fully compromised, and that those rounds were so punky they were exploding when they hit the ground. The top is where the branches are attached, and really this was a dam_ed if you do, da_ned if you don't situation for the municipality; it was take the trees down now and face the music, or wait until a large branch broke off and hurt someone.

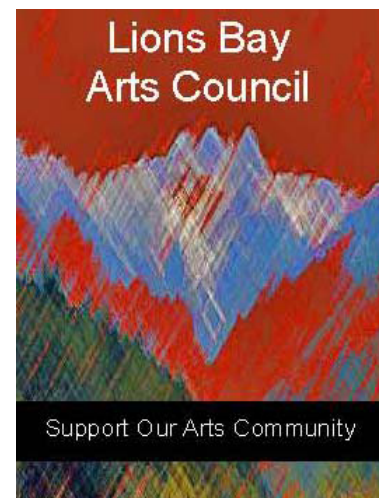
The Lions Bay Arts Council Annual General Meeting and Members' Reception is on May 5th. There are lots of exciting changes coming,

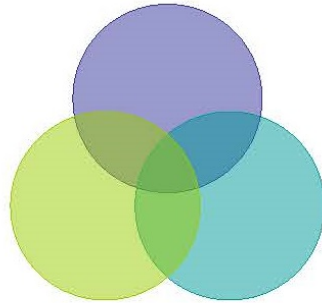
This 10 week program (April 3rd to June 5th) is dedicated to experimenting and creating, while meeting a few new friends.

CURLY STEWART MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AWARD

The Curly Stewart Memorial Trust Fund was established to honour the life and public service of the first mayor of the Village of Lions Bay, Allan M. "Curly" Stewart, who served from 1971 to 1981. A \$500 scholarship is awarded annually from the trust fund, to the applicant who best exemplifies the criteria described in the official terms of reference for the award, which are, in no particular order:

- Lions Bay, British Columbia, Canada and world citizenship (for example, leadership, fundraising, volunteering, organisations, travel, family);
- Academic, athletic, arts or personal achievement (for example, schooling, offices held, awards and prizes, team participation, work experience);
- Future plans (for example, study, travel, career, service).
- And such other qualifying requirements as may be set out in this application.

Applications must be received by the Village Office no later than 4:30 pm on April 30, 2018.
