From the Mayor's Desk

Hello Neighbours,

Two things this week. First, the all-hands-on-deck call for volunteers at Lions Bay Field for this Saturday is off. You may have noticed that the field was plug-aerated by a contractor yesterday (by donation from many residents, including a lot of the kids who use the field the most. Thanks, all). But now the school district has offered to not only supply 20 tons of top-dressing (note the huge pile), but to spread it with power tools on Monday. I'll point out that grass school fields throughout the district are normally maintained by their local municipalities--West Van, Bowen and Lions Bay--so I am most grateful for this offer. So, sorry if you were looking forward to a Saturday morning of back-breaking labour, but the news is not all bad. Keep your powder dry and equipment at the ready for VOLUNTEER DAY on JUNE 20, a full day of heavy lifting to refurbish our in-Village trails, and to chop and chip a lot of deadfall to reduce fire hazard. The plan is still being worked on, but will involve more power tools, a barbeque and more.

Also, kudos to former Councillor Ruth Simons for spearheading the Community Safety Forum last night. We had impressive presentations from Sgt. Peter Busink of the Conservation Officer Service, from Community Policing Coordinator Kathryn Hennigar and SSgt Brian Cumming of our RCMP detachment, from Mike Teske of our Coastal District Fire Service, from several members of our own Lions Bay Fire & Rescue, from Ingrid Wray and the Emergency Social Services team, and from the Lions Bay Infrastructure Committee. I try to keep informed, but I learned a ton of new stuff. Did you know that a bear's sense of smell is seven times better than a bloodhound's, that they WILL smell garbage, and that it's up to us to make sure they can't get at it? WATER MAIN FLUSHING UPDATE

The Public Works Department's spring water main flushing program is officially ahead of schedule – crews have completed flushing work on Oceanview Road, Upper Kelvin Grove Way, and Isleview (and side roads). They will be starting on Brunswick Beach, Lower Lions Bay, and Lower Kelvin Grove (and side roads) on Monday, April 27th. INFRASTRUCTURE QUESTION OF THE WEEK

- Q: As with most utility companies and municipalities, does the Village of Lions Bay utilize a GIS based system to actively record and track deficiencies with their infrastructure, including: utilities, roads, drainage, trees, trails, etc.? Could such a GIS-based system be utilized to replace the 'abundant' use of fluorescent orange paint?
- A: Lions Bay has a GIS based recording of some of our physical structures mainly our water infrastructure. It has been developed over the years mostly by volunteers and students as there has been little budget available due to our small financial resource base, and has not been used historically to record and track deficiencies. It does have most residential water service connection valves entered into it, however many things can change on a parcel over time that obscure what the GIS tells us such as landscaping, overgrowth, structures being placed upon infrastructure located below ground level, and work done over the years that was not captured in the system. Public Works crews have been actively seeking out water service connection valves as they hunt down Village-wide water leaks and to ensure they can shut off the water to a residence as opposed to the entire street should an emergency arise. Hence, the orange paint you have noted it marks infrastructure recently uncovered that crews need to test. The only way to decrease the amount of orange paint is to have residents ensure their water service connection is easily visible.

It should also be noted that crews mark out municipal infrastructure as part of the BC 1 Call service for contractors and other agencies that are working in the area, as it is a fail-safe method of marking underground infrastructure that removes the risk of contractor error in reading a drawing.
