Council thanks outgoing Volunteers Jan and Tina Schneider

Jan shared his amateur radio, communication, and technology skills with both the LB Emergency Management Committee, and as a member of North Shore Emergency Management (NSEM) program. Tina took her communication training and was there as a backup for her brother.

Both were trained in every component of the ESS program and assisted in developing various exercises for the team.

Pets are a love for both, and Tina spent considerable time planning for the care of small animals affected by disaster.

The LB ESS sticker was designed by Jan.

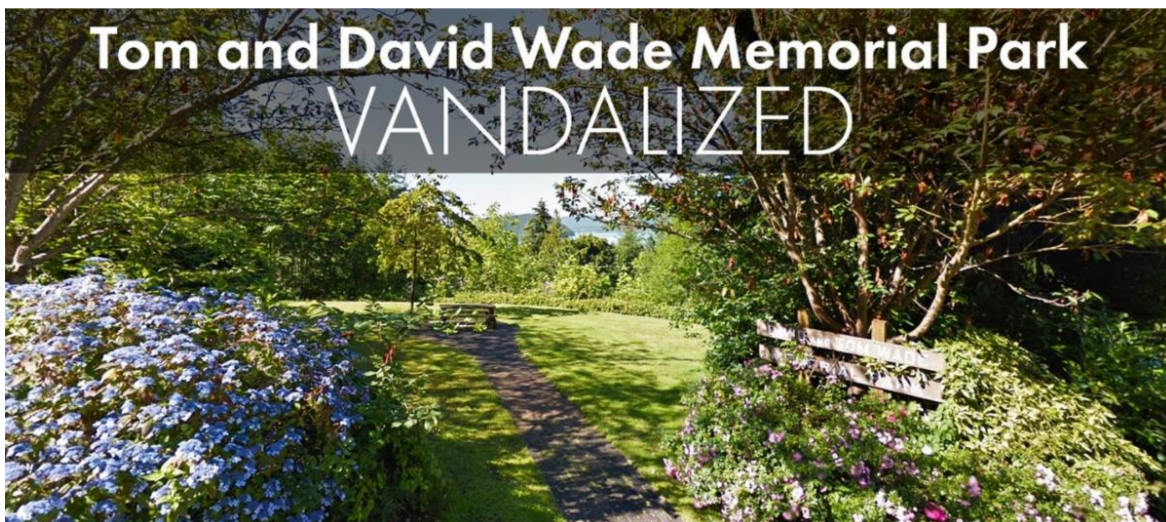
We have appreciated their hearts for service as they made themselves available for what ever came their way in service to our community.



Residents of Isleview Place should by now have received a letter in the mail advising of a necessary interruption in water on March 30, 2022, between the hours of 9:00 am and 3:00 pm. This work is taking place in advance of the paving works scheduled to take place later this spring and is required to facilitate the replacement of a valve and fire hydrant at the entrance to Isleview Place. Staff will do their utmost to restore water as soon as possible but plan an outage for the full 6 hours.

Residents may experience discoloured water after the repair and should clear their water lines once water service has resumed. To do this simply let a cold-water tap (remove screens/aerators on tap) closest to the incoming water line run until the water flows clear. Any amendments to the duration of the shut down or date of the work will be posted in the Village Update so please make sure you are registered to receive it here: www.lionsbay.ca/vu.

We understand that this work will cause significant inconveniences and we apologise in advance for this. On Tuesday morning, March 15, 2022, Public Works staff noticed that two 'ornamental cherry' trees on the west bank of Tom and David Wade Memorial Park had been cut down. Ornamental cherry trees are flowering cherry trees that are closely related to orchard cherry trees but are not grown for their fruit. Rather, ornamental cherries are

grown for their ornamental properties, particularly their springtime floral displays. These two trees ([see photos](#)) were a part of the improved landscape look that Public Works was trying to achieve and the blossoms this spring would have enhanced the beauty of the park.

[Tree Bylaw No. 393](#) protects all the Village's arboreal assets and only allows for the cutting and removal of Municipally owned trees through an application process. Trees and vegetation in public parks are also protected under [Parks Bylaw No. 448](#) and individuals cannot cut down trees or other vegetation in public parks because the trees or vegetation might be blocking a view or because persons don't care for the look of them. This is punishable by a \$500 fine per tree.
