

Public Works is asking residents to conserve water

At this time of year, especially during high and extreme fire danger rating periods, it's important for us to keep the Harvey and Magnesia Creek water tanks topped up in case of fire fighting needs. Please do your part to help us conserve water and maintain our reserve capacities by reviewing the indoor and outdoor water conservation tips in the Water Conservation Brochure.

Under the current **Conservation Level 2** restrictions, lawn watering is restricted to **one day per week** as follows:

- Mondays for even-numbered addresses from 4 am to 9 am
- Thursdays for odd numbered addresses from 4 am to 9 am

Watering of trees, shrubs, flowers, or vegetables is only permitted if watering by hand using a spring-loaded nozzle, container, or by drip irrigation.

No washing of outdoor surfaces is permitted, including pressure washing. Washing of vehicles and boats is only allowed by bucket. <u>See the attached infographic for a representation of the restrictions.</u>

Bylaw Enforcement Officers have been tasked with ensuring these restrictions are adhered to and watering your lawn outside of allowed times and without a water exemption permit could result in a \$100 fine.

What do I do if I see someone else not following the Level 2 rules?

If you are comfortable doing so, please let them know the details of the restrictions that are in place in case they are not aware we are on Level 2 and need to take water conservation seriously. MESSAGE FROM LIONS BAY FIRE RESCUE

Hello All,

First off, thank you for a very successful Fire Fighters' Day. We were sad to not be able to hold this event for you over the past 2 years, and we are so glad to be back. We hope everyone enjoyed it as much as we did.

With the generous donations we have received over the last few years, we were able to purchase a state-of-the-art Auto Extrication tool that will help us keep our skills sharp and our practices honed. Our regular tools are powered by hydraulic pumps, and although they work quite well, they have down sides, such as tangled hydraulic lines, the mess the fluid can make and the weight of the tools. We were able to purchase a combination Spreader and Cutter that is powered by battery. When arriving on scene at a car accident and having to extricate a patient, we are taught that we should work to get that person from time of accident to the hospital in under one hour; this is called "The Golden Hour". Tools such as this one will help immensely in reducing our time on scene. We just received the equipment this month and we are so excited to be able to practice with it!

We would also like to let residents know that we are open for applications to be part of our department. The commitment is very manageable, and the training, lessons and rewards are many. MESSAGE FROM BEAR SMART

Rewilding Apennines visit to Lions Bay on September 20th, 2022

On Tuesday, Lions Bay Bear Smart hosted a group of 17 individuals from small towns in Italy and Greece who came to learn about Bear Smart and how we do it in Lions Bay. We're the only small town they're visiting while in Canada: most of the group are themselves from small communities and strongly related to our journey.

They also spent time with the North Shore Black Bear Society and met with Squamish wildlife officers and Whistler Bear Aware during their week in Canada.

The group was made up of scientists, experts, National Park Managers, municipal officials (including one mayor), conservationists and activists, among others. <u>Rewilding Apennines</u>, one of several rewilding chapters in Europe, arranged the EU grant-funded trip. Their common goal is to establish a Bear Smart program to protect Marsican Brown Bears and manage human/bear conflicts, but they are also involved in a wide range of other conservation/rehabilitation projects.

They were also keen to hear about other conservation efforts in the Village. The Bird Friendly Initiative provided information on the Bird Friendly City program and you may have spotted the excited group walking down to the native plant garden and then up to the Centennial trail on Tuesday afternoon.

Many thanks to Val Morton and Frances Gordon for hosting them in the garden and John and Rose Dudley, Trudy Leuthy and Doug Craig for accompanying them to the Eagle View Loop. Thank you also to Marilyne Cary for the home baked cakes, crudite and ordering and collecting lunch, and to Frances for the smoked salmon canapes. The Café provided fresh coffee.
