The office is busy this week receiving utility payments to move our village forward.










Picture: Mayor Berry and Team at water intake








Picture: New sand in the kids play area

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN LIONS BAY


You're invited!

Mary Comber Miles Indigenous Plant Garden Society

The Mary Comber Miles Indigenous Plant Garden showcases the biodiversity and beauty of Pacific Northwest native plants. It highlights the need to preserve and protect plant biodiversity as a world heritage resource in the face of expanding urbanization and development. It is open to the public, and everyone is welcome to visit.

Efforts to develop the Mary Comber Miles Indigenous Plant Garden began in 2009, with the Village donating a lot-sized area for the project and volunteers clearing the site of rubbish, weeds, and non-native plants. Paths were laid out, bark mulch, soil and plants were purchased or donated, and gardening began in earnest. Today, the garden supports more than 65 native species.

This May, with the collaboration of the Village's Public Works, local gardeners planted the Lions Bay Trailhead Garden, with a focus on native species. Plants were selected to provide pollinators with food sources throughout the year, and for all stages of life. Caterpillars, or butterfly larvae, for example, need suitable host plants for food. Mature butterflies require plants that bloom throughout the growing season, so food sources are always available.

The Trailhead Garden is part of a broader effort to create pathways for pollinator species. If you are interested in more information about how to create a butterfly garden or a planting guide on how to attract pollinators, please check out the **David Suzuki**Foundation.org

Throughout May, gardeners at the Mary Comber Miles Indigenous Plant Garden have been sharing information about gardening to support pollinator species.
