### **Interim CFO/CAO departs**

Thank you, Ron Miller, for filling in as Interim CFO/CAO to May 30th, 2023. Ron, who accepted a short-term part-time CFO position to assist us to get our Budget completed, graciously accepted the role of Interim CAO/CFO when our Interim CAO was unable to continue. Ron will now continue his planned retirement.

#### Mayor Assumes CEO Position Pending Council Appointment of a New CAO

As Mayor and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) per Provincial legislation, Lions Bay's Provincial Advisor Randy Diehl has confirmed that I will fulfill the appropriate duties of a CEO by providing a liaison between operations and council, providing guidance, support, and direction to staff to ensure the operations continue in as effective a manner as possible. My first two days in the office have been a productive time, I'm impressed with the staff capability, tone, and service orientation.

#### **Building Inspector**

Mike Jury has completed his training and will be filling this very crucial role of building inspector. Following the hiring of Mr. Jury by our former Interim CAO and the successful completion of his training courses, the final step in the process as confirmed by our Provincial Advisors, is for council to officially appoint the building inspector at the next council meeting.

#### **Provincial Advisor Governance Workshop**

Our provincial advisors Randy Diehl and Deanna Campbell will be conducting a workshop on Governance this Sunday June 4th with our council and mayor. The Governance Workshop will take a full day and its main focus is to provide an opportunity to reflect on what are the Best Practices, how have we done things in the past, what needs to change to not only meet the legal requirements of Local Government but to also make improvements on how Council currently does business within itself, with staff and most importantly, with the residents.

## **Highly Toxic!**

- All parts of Spurge Laurel are poisonous
- Contains sap that causes skin rashes and blistering

## **Key ID features**

- Rhododendron-like leaves that are dark green, shiny, smooth and thick
- Small clusters of fragrant pale green-yellow flowers
- Purple-black berries
- Stems are fragrant once cut



## What to do: Lions Bay

- Spurge Laurel is to be contained to Lions Bay to avoid its spread further north
- Talk to your landscaping company about removing it or go to www.ssisc.ca/spurgelaurel



## You're invited!



## **Gardening for Beauty and Habitat Vitality**

Please join us at the Mary Comber Miles Indigenous Plant Garden on June 17th from 10:30 am to noon for a fun and informative event highlighting how to support native biodiversity by planting for pollinators. We are part of the David Suzuki Foundation's **Butterflyway Project** and we are excited to let you know about this upcoming event.

The aim of the event is to encourage the planting of native wildflowers that support local bees, butterflies and other pollinators. Insects are in decline and every patch of wildflowers, big and small, can help bring them back! Our goal is to help establish at least a dozen pollinator-friendly gardens in Lions Bay for the village to be officially recognized as a Butterflyway.

To kick off the event, Master Gardener Jane Sherrott, who gardens at the Ambleside Pollinator Garden with a group of volunteers, will give a short presentation about how to plant for four seasons of bloom. Jane will discuss current research identifying plants that support the highest number and widest range of pollinators. Following Jane's presentation, you will learn some cool facts about some of our native bees, an important part of the 'pollinator crew'. Free native plants will be available for you to take home to grow your own Butterflyway patch. And you can snack on delicious baked treats!
