UPDATES FROM THE MUNICIPALITY





Property Taxes are due Friday, July 14th by 4:00 p.m.

Just a reminder that property taxes are due Friday, July 14th by 4:00 p.m. If paying by cheque, please drop your payment off at the Village Office in person or after hours through the mail slot; cheques must be received in the mail prior to the due date.

Any payments received after the due date must be processed as overdue and assessed a penalty. A 5% penalty will be applied on July 15 and 5% on September 2 if still unpaid.



All taxpayers must claim their HOG (if eligible) every year. If your grant is not claimed by the July 14th due date, a 5% penalty will be applied to your account.

If you are deferring your taxes or have set up a renewal for your tax deferral, you still need to claim your HOG before, or as soon as possible after, submitting your online application to the Ministry.

Your deferral will be delayed if you have taxes in arrears. And an unclaimed HOG amount will become taxes in arrears if not claimed during the tax year.

Your HOG must be claimed online at **gov.bc.ca/homeowner grant**. Please use the information at the bottom of your Property Tax Notice to submit your claim (circled in red below):


• Public participation is still available on Zoom, during the Public Participation

The Village Office has a collection box for the Third World Eye Care Society (TWECS), which collects gently used prescription eyeglasses for distribution to those with no or


limited access to eye care. Their team of eye doctors and volunteers provide eye exams and glasses in Third World countries, having completed over 30 missions in 19 countries since 1995.

The Bird Friendly team will be at the Canada Day event tomorrow from 3.30 – 5pm with our brand new Birder Backpack kits containing a really good pair of binoculars, field guides and more. These are available to borrow at no cost for your summer hikes, showing visiting family our fantastic birds and other wildlife... come see what we have!

We'll also have Nature Guides packed full of family outdoor activities around Metro Vancouver over the summer. There may be some other little Bird Friendly surprises as well...





Our local beach is a beautiful wild habitat, an inspiring recreational spot and a wonderful outdoor classroom! Come join us at **10.30am on Saturday**, **July 15th** for a super fun, family friendly event where we will learn and discover while cleaning up garbage along the shoreline, making our beach better for birds and wildlife. This event is organized by LB Bird Friendly team member Danielle Wills.

What to expect: interesting facts, beach bingo, a treasure hunt, bird spotting and a BBQ!

We'll gather at the picnic table by the kayak racks at 10.30. We'll talk about marine plastic pollution and learn about some of our local Lions Bay shorebirds, including the Great Blue Heron. Then we'll begin our cleanup, moving north along the beach. During the cleanup, kids will play "beach bingo", and learn all kinds of fun and interesting facts about local nature.

In addition to picking up garbage, there will be hidden treasure items along the way for kids to discover and collect. Danielle will demonstrate how to use apps such as **Seek** and **Merlin** (which you could download beforehand if you'd like to try them) to identify species we might encounter along the way. If we encounter some of our shorebirds along the way, we will use this opportunity to do a bird count. All educational pieces will be family friendly and engaging for kids and adults alike. We will be back at the picnic table close to 12 noon, where we will briefly examine and photograph our finds for the day. We will be recording and reporting many of the items that we find. Participate in citizen science while helping our beach to look its best!

For those who prefer to hang out on the beach, we'll have some binoculars on hand for a close up look at cormorants, goldeneyes or whatever sea life we can spot.

Hot dogs off the BBQ and pop will be available from 11.30.

What to bring:

Please bring along a small bucket and gloves if you have them, we will have extra available at the picnic table. Also don't forget a hat, sunscreen, and water! We will be walking along the shoreline which is rocky, so please wear good shoes.
