# A MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL

The first regular Council meeting after the summer break took place on Tuesday night. After a two-month extension to his original three-month appointment, Municipal Advisor Randy Diehl's ministry contract came to an end on August 31st bringing his time with Lions Bay to an end. Acting Corporate Officer/consultant Deanna Campbell left us at the end of July.

We are pleased to announce that Council has signed a contract with Ross Blackwell as our new Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) and that he will be joining us before the next regular Council meeting. This is a permanent appointment and we look forward to having Ross's leadership in the Village Office. Please see the letter of introduction Ross has provided which follows.

We believe all these changes indicate positive steps forward with more to come.

## **UPDATES FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS YARD**



Drivers on mid-Bayview will experience Lions Bay's first traffic lights, albeit temporarily, through next week. They're needed to one-lane the road for a laydown area for the Alberta Creek driveway bridge renovation. Please proceed with care: the traffic system went haywire on Thursday--it was being returned to righteousness today, but you never know.



We're not out of the woods yet for water. With this week's rains totalling only 1.5 mm at the Harvey plant's rain gauge, we're back to four hour fill cycles overnight and longer during the day on the Harvey Creek system (which supplies 80% of the Village until we fund more tankage at Magnesia). The rain barely registered in creek flows: Harvey Creek is producing 325 gallons per minute, Mag about 280. Village-wide consumption is ranging from 518,000 to 490,000 gallons per day, an average of 360 to 340 gallons per minute. The constraint is the Harvey plant and it's complaining. The crew down here at the Yard implore everyone to do what they can to keep us out of Level 3. Unpleasant, that would be.



# Hyperphagia

An increase in bear feeding activity that is driven by a biological need to fatten up before winter

### A CRITICAL TIME FOR BEARS

The fat reserves a bear builds during the fall are critical for their survival. If they don't get enough to eat in the fall, mothers won't produce cubs and some bears can die in their den. The reserves built from hyperphagia will last the bear through winter and well into the following spring.

#### TIME OF YEAR

Hyperphagia typically lasts mid August through to late September or October, during which time bears will feed and drink upwards to 20 hours a day!





#### HUMANS NEED TO BE EXTRA VIGILANT

We need to take every precaution during this time to help prevent human-bear conflict. This means managing attractants like bird feeders, garbage, fruit trees and keeping your BBQ clean. Keep your doors and windows closed and locked, especially at night and when you are out.

#### WINTER DEN

With few natural foods available in the winter, black bears enter a state of dormancy (or hibernation) to conserve energy. On the south coast, black bears typically hibernate for 3 to 5 months. When bears enter their dens they can go without food and water or the need to go to the bathroom!
