UPDATES FROM THE MUNICIPALITY

At the Special Council Meeting on Thursday this week, Council again carefully considered opening of the parking at the trail heads in the Village. After discussion regarding lack of rain, dryness of vegetation, potential fire risk associated with hiker activity, general concern for Village safety, and the recommendations from the Village Fire Chief and other associated agencies, Council decided to defer to technical agency recommendations. Accordingly, parking will be opened immediately.

Also at this meeting, Council discussed matters pertaining to the Village Emergency Plan and the need for an evacuation plan. It was noted that the Emergency Plan/Brochure disseminated to residents in 2022 and posted to the Village Update provides a functional framework but requires additional modifications to address both changing legislative requirements and gaps in the existing plan such as potable water security.
