Our annualised watermain flushing program is going well, with no untoward or unexpected events. We have been salting each zone after it drains off in case of a freeze, and with the weekend imminent, and wet snow and a soft freeze possible, we are going to suspend operations until next week to finish the remaining third of the job.

BC Hydro has provided input to resident questions.

LIONS BAY SUBSTATION FEED: Lions Bay substation is on a 69 kilovolt transmission line that runs between substations at Squamish and Horseshoe Bay. Lions Bay is typically fed from Horseshoe Bay but able to be fed from the north if the transmission line to the south goes out of service. If both sections of the transmission line are out of service, feed can be tied to a 12 kV subcircuit from the Horseshoe Bay substation. Changes are manual, and involve multiple crews, which need some hours to reach sites and perform the required switching.

RECENT OUTAGES: Lions Bay is fed by transmission lines running in difficult terrain and dense forest, and exposed to severe weather events. The exact cause of the outage in

August is not known, but is most likely due to trees or branches, possibly weakened by two years of summer drought, falling on a transmission line during severe weather, triggering a circuit protection outage, and falling to the ground before Hydro got there, a common occurrence. The August outage lasted 4 hours and 19 minutes. During that period, two crews hiked the 230 kilovolt main transmission line running from Cypress Mountain to the Horseshoe Bay substation from either end and met in the middle without finding a cause. Due to some sections being impassable on foot, a team member was dispatched to Whistler to commence a helicopter assessment of the lines as soon as the weather allowed, finding no cause either. Circuit protection elements were reclosed, and power was restored. Other than an 11 minute outage during maintenance work in February, all of 2023's outages align with weather events:


