FROM THE "YARD"

Saturday bear season supplemental garbage and compostables drop off at the Yard is now over, and will resume in the Spring. Friday drop off runs year-round, and the Yard is open for landfill garbage and compostables only (not recyclables, sorry) from 06:00am to 8:00am if you miss or can't make street pickup.

The annual watermain flush went well, and was completed today. It was needed, and Public Works thanks residents for their patience and cooperation. If your water pressure is now perhaps not what you're used to, check mesh screens on taps, showerheads, and possibly the private-side pressure reducing valve (call a plumber if uncertain what's involved). A more serious cause for loss of water pressure is a leak in the service line. Public Works would be happy to come by and help diagnose, especially if you hear water running when you're not using any, or there's an unexplained wet patch outside. We're mostly in the field and not here to answer the desk phone, so email is best, works@lionsbay.ca.

Are you and your family set up to know what's happening in Lions Bay during an emergency? Lions Bay uses Alertable to inform residents of critical information during an emergency. Updates and resident instructions regarding wildfires, evacuations, etc. will be communicated through Alertable.

Singing up is very easy and you can receive messages on the Alertable App for smartphones and tablets, via SMS notifications on your cell phone or even receive a phone call on a land line. This really is the easiest way to receive information during an emergency.

We currently have 621 people signed up on Alertable. Is everyone in your household signed up? What if you are at work out of the village and your family is at home? Will they receive emergency messages?

TransLink Connector Project:

Discussions with TransLink indicate the Village of Lions Bay has the flexibility to do a scope change on all or a portion of the project.

Options:

KEEP Original Plan (Scope):

- New Transit bus shelter on Lions Bay Ave SW on ramp
- Sidewalk from bus shelter to bottom of Lions Bay Ave

CHANGE All or a Portion of the Project. New Ideas may include:

- Trails or Pathways (ie: Pride Trail; KG to LB path; Beach Trail/Jetty)
- Transit related infrastructure (Bus Shelter; Toilets; electric transportation)
- Other new ideas

CANCEL All or a Portion of the \$430,000 Infrastructure Improvements

FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

TransLink Grant (75%) Village Funds (25%) Project Total ~\$323,000 ~\$107,000 ~\$430,000




