UPDATES FROM THE MUNICIPALITY



In accordance with the Village of Lions Bay Trees, Views, and Landscapes Bylaw No. 393, 2007, the cutting of trees on Municipal Property during active bird nesting season, which is between **March 26th and August 16th each year, is prohibited.**

If you want to do some tree work and those trees are on Municipal property, you'll need to apply for a tree cutting permit ASAP as the window to obtain Council approval is dwindling. The **March 19th** Council meeting is the last meeting you can get your application approved so that your work can happen before the **March 26th deadline** – after that, you're going to have to wait until mid-August unless you get Council dispensation to undertake a nesting survey with a registered biologist at your cost to establish there are no bird nests in the vicinity of the trees you wish to cut.

2024 DOG & BOAT SPACE LICENSES

Reminder that dog and boat space licenses are now due. The early discount payment is applicable for dog licenses until February 29th and for boat spaces, until March 31st.

FROM THE YARD



Turning vehicles unexpectedly stopping on Oceanview and Centre, and close calls in the pedestrian crosswalks at either end of Crosscreek, have Public Works calling in assistance from ICBC's Road Safety Improvement Program. Several traffic counters will soon be installed to gather speed and volume data. In the meantime we've augmented four Stop signs with warning signage to help drivers new to that area understand what's expected.



Our Pride Path trail remediation project will launch in the next few weeks. At Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure behest and funding, we are clearing spoil from behind the concrete barriers at the south end of the Lions Bay Beach Park parking lot, and installing a 60 meter row of large boulders as protection against material eroding out of the escarpment above the trail and below the highway. The geotechnical report is available HERE. The trail will be closed to public use for about 10 days.



The Village's four pay parking meters have been moved to storage by the service provider and pay parking signage has been taken down for the season (because there's now no way to pay by meter, and it'd be inconsistent to keep app-only zones open). 


REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS TO SIT ON THE CURLY STEWART MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AWARD COMMITTEE
