KLATT RONOVATION PROJECT UPDATE


- Completed this week:
 - Drywall installation

- First floor window installation
- Construction of both external staircases and landings
- Next week works:
 - Priming and painting to start
 - Doors install pending delivery
 - Installation of the exterior compressor and compressor cover
 - · Potential install of the exterior railings
- Project remains on schedule with a target date of substantial completion in September with latest in October.

FROM THE YARD

1. We're still good at Outdoor Water Use conservation Level 1. Supply is above plant capacity today, and demand has been under control all summer. Thanks!

However, once the recent rain completes flowing on the surface and percolating into the creeks, , until the next rain they resume their linear decay profile, per Darcy's Law for flows through porous media. The next rain is forecast for the second week of September, ever closer to the main rains:



2.Look for a full dog-and-person drinking fountain at the Sunset trailhead, in response to our Drinking Water Officer's order to take steps to "minimize...contamination of the watershed." It's intended to demonstrate that actual drinking water is sourced up there, and that care should be taken not to contaminate same.

3. On Council directive, the Kelvin Grove Beach & Marine Park pay parking lot will be closed all day tomorrow, Aug. 31, for a private event. Street parking remains available for

Annual/Guest/Contractor Permit holders, and visitors will be directed by signage and a private security guard to the Lions Bay Beach Park lot. It will be a busy summer day in Lions Bay.



If you missed garbage pickup or cannot make the regular pick up schedule, the Works Yard (5 Tidewater Way) is open every Friday 6am to 8am and Saturday from 8am to 11am to take organics and household garbage. A friendly reminder to only drop off during the specified times and to deposit into the applicable garbage bins.

The Works Yard cannot dispose of construction or demolition garbage. That includes but is not limited to styrofoam, e-waste/electronics, construction debris, furniture, paint and solvents, fluorescents, batteries and mattresses, which all need to be taken to the North Shore Recycling & Waste Facility at 30 Riverside Drive in North Vancouver (all the details here).



HUMANS NEED TO BE EXTRA VIGILANT

We need to take every precaution during this time to help prevent human-bear conflict. This means managing attractants like bird feeders, garbage, fruit trees and keeping your BBQ clean. Keep your doors and windows closed and locked, especially at night and when you are out.

WINTER DEN

With few natural foods available in the winter, black bears enter a state of dormancy (or hibernation) to conserve energy. On the south coast, black bears typically hibernate for 3 to 5 months. When bears enter their dens they can go without food and water or the need to go to the bathroom!
