It's Fall and Bears are Active in the Village: When Will They Leave for Their Dens?

As is usual for this time of year, we've seen an uptick in bear activity as bears forage in preparation for their winter hibernation. During this period, they're searching out high calorie food to get them through to Spring, but will move onto grass and vegetation as they get closer to denning.

According to the Vince Shute Wildlife Sanctuary in the US, after the busy feeding period called hyperphagia, "Bears become lethargic and enter a stage called 'fall transition' this time of year, but when do the bears leave for their dens?

"Every bear has their own timeline. Typically, we see mothers and cubs leave first, in late

August and early September. Next, the chonky male and female adults leave! Last to leave are the old, sick, injured and the goofy, inexperienced 1 to 3-year-olds that didn't take the hyperphagia stage very seriously. All of these bears stick around as they need a little more time to try to gain the appropriate amount of weight to sustain themselves during hibernation".

We've received bear sightings (thank you), including one "chonky" bear and one "goofy yearling" who's heading into his first winter without mom and is figuring things out.

Please be ultra-careful with attractants in your yard and follow the usual guidelines so that food waste, garbage, bird feeders, pet food, fruit and BBQ grease are not accessible to wildlife. Attractant issues should be reported to bylaw@lionsbay.ca immediately.

Thank you to everyone who is doing their absolute best to keep the bears and our community safe.


