UPDATES FROM THE MUNICIPALITY

BROUGHTON HALL STORAGE ROOM CLEANUP

The hall storage room has become quite a mess and is unfortunately, no longer functional. We are doing a deep cleanup of the space and will require your assistance if your group stores items in the storage room. Please disregard this message if you do not.

UPDATES FROM THE FIRE CHIEF



Lions Bay Fire Rescue was given the opportunity to use a home slated for demolition for realistic training scenarios, training sessions like this are very valuable in preparing LBFR members to the challenges they may face.

By using a combination of theatrical smoke, road flares and “Rescue Randy” training dolls we are able to safely recreate some of the challenges encountered at the scene of a fire.

LBFR firefighters train weekly at our training facility but having access to a structure and property that we are not familiar with makes the lesson more challenging, LBFR firefighters all know the floorplan of our training building making fire attack and patient search easy. Using this structure makes these same processes more realistic and challenging.

LBFR would like to thank the home owners for permitting us to use their property, I would like to thank Koba Construction for adjusting their site schedule and providing access and assistance, and also a thank you to the neighbourhood members whose little piece of heaven we encroached on for a few hours.
