- Make your emergency plan https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/safety/emergency-management/preparedbc/make-your-plan
- Pre-register for Emergency Support Services on Evacuee and Registration Assistance (ERA) ess.gov.bc.ca
- Add your insurance information to your emergency plan to ensure it's handy when you need it. You can also keep the below link handy with any insurance related questions

- Know how to turn off your utilities. Make this part of your emergency plan. Make sure everyone knows how to do this.
- Have an out-of-area emergency contact who the family can touch base with if you are separated during an emergency. Make this part of your communication plan.
- Make a pet plan. Have leashes, harnesses, cages, food and medicines ready for quick access. https://www.cdart.org/preparing-for-a-disaster
- Build your emergency kit (for shelter in place) and your Grab-and-Go bag (for immediate evacuations) https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/safety/emergency-management/preparedbc/build-an-emergency-kit-and-grab-and-go-bag
- Sign up for emergency messaging through the Alertable app. https://alertable.ca
- Keep an old pair of shoes under each bed. If you need to evacuate your home quickly and household debris (broken glass, building material) is littering the floor, these can be use to allow you to safely move about your house.
 - Save digital copies of important documents, such as birth certificates and financial records on a memory stick, or make photocopies of them. Place these in your grab-and-go bag.

Landfill garbage + recycling & compostables/yardwaste

Compostables/yardwaste collection: weekl

- Branches must be smaller than 3in x 3ft
- Paper liners or certified compostable bags only (available for purchase at Municipal Office)

SEPARATED recycling collection: weekly

- BLUE BIN: hard plastic containers and packaging, metal cans, aluminum trays
- GREY BIN: glass (goes to a separate facility than the Blue Bin)
- YELLOW BAG: newspaper, card, mixed paper. Flatten large cardboard & place next to bag.

Landfill garbage collection: bi-weekly

- Place bins your bins curbside at the beginning of the time slot for your street on collection day to ensure pick up.
- Limit to 2 garbage cans (121 liters total)
- Buy your tag-a-can sticker from Lions Bay municipal office for one extra pick up

Styrofoam & soft plastic is not accepted curbside in Lions Bay, and must be taken to a recycling centre by residents. Lions Bay is a member municipality of the North Shore Recycling & Waste Centre, 30 Riverside Drive W., North Vancouver.


