UPDATES FROM THE MUNICIPALITY

NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION THE VILLAGE OFFICE WILL BE CLOSED TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 2025



As fall approaches there is a heightened risk of severe weather, including heavy rainfall, windstorms, and atmospheric rivers. These events can lead to flooding, power outages, landslides, and transportation disruptions, especially in areas with vulnerable infrastructure or steep terrain. Homeowners should inspect roofs and gutters, clear storm drains, and ensure that sump pumps and drainage systems are functioning properly. It's also important to secure outdoor furniture and trim overhanging branches that could fall during high winds.

Preparedness also means being ready for potential isolation or outages. Stock up on essentials like flashlights, batteries, non-perishable food, drinking water, and warm clothing. Make sure you have an emergency kit and a household plan that includes how to communicate and where to go if evacuation is necessary. Staying informed through local weather alerts and Alertable updates can help you act quickly if conditions worsen.



WATER METERING

Individual property water service valves have recently been marked by Public Works staff, and the contractor executing the metering pre-install site census will start on Oct. 12 for up to six weeks of field work. Expect to see crews working the streets; if they need to enter private property they will knock on the door, but all they are looking at is the orientation of the water service line to determine the optimal location of the meter box to our specification.

The zone metering component of the fully grant funded \$4 mil. project is progressing well, with six of 14 zone hydraulic controls installed and awaiting BC Hydro power installs, and in some cases Telus data drops (given the Provincial pilot nature of the project, we are comparing cellular modem connectivity with high bandwidth fibre). The zone project is already bearing fruit: with existing power and new data connectivity at the "School" PRV-13 we can now remotely select whether to supply the zone below it from the Harvey Plant or the Magnesia Plant. On Magnesia supply, we see flows on the Harvey line through PRV-14 at Upper Bayview go to zero overnight, meaning we now know Zone 14 below it currently has no leaks.
