From the CAO's Desk

(Week 16)

It was a busy and productive week at Beach Park, with continued progress across several areas of the site. Work focused on recontouring the grassed slope area and preparing the upper playground space in advance of upcoming installations. These improvements are helping shape the final layout of the park and enhance both safety and usability.

Looking ahead to next week, construction of the new washroom building will begin. Roof support columns are scheduled for delivery on Monday, marking an important milestone in the project.

Overall, work continues to progress on schedule, with substantial completion currently targeted for mid-March. Further updates will be provided as construction advances.





1. This week and next, contractors for Ministry of Transport and Transit (formerly Highways, Infrastructure and others) are clearing the debris retention structure on Harvey Creek. We reiterate that that large structure is not a storage dam: the creek runs right through it! Yes, Lions Bay has no raw water reservoirs, instead drawing drinking water for treatment straight from the Village's three creeks as needed, with a buffer of one to two days of treated water in the tanks depending on fill levels set for fire reserve, chlorine contact and usage. More on this and other water topics, including details on the upcoming AZAP metering project and how we will use it deliver ever better quality drinking water, at [All-Zone All-Property Water Metering 2025/26](#)
2. Expect to see hydrovac, ground penetrating radar and survey crews on Centre and the Bayviews next week, collecting data on existing underground mains elevations, new mains tie-ins and confirming missing details on the current as-builts, for the CUBB watermain replacement later this year.

Coming Soon: 2026 Citizen Satisfaction Survey

In early February, the Municipality will be launching a 2026 Citizen Satisfaction Survey, providing residents with an opportunity to share their perspectives on municipal services, priorities, and overall community experience.

The survey is designed to gather meaningful feedback on how municipal services are performing and where improvements may be needed. The information collected will help staff better understand community priorities, identify strengths, and inform future planning and service delivery decisions.

As part of a commitment to good governance and continuous improvement, the Municipality's goal is to conduct this type of survey every two to three years. Repeating the survey on a regular cycle allows for benchmarking over time, helping to measure progress, track trends, and ensure that municipal services continue to align with community expectations.

All survey responses will be completely anonymous, encouraging open and honest feedback from participants. The results will be analyzed in aggregate and used to support evidence-based decision-making and operational planning.

Further details about the survey, including how to participate, will be shared as the launch date approaches in early February. Residents are encouraged to take part and help shape the future of municipal services in the community.

2026 Speculation and Vacancy Tax Information

Homeowners in designated taxable areas will soon receive their annual speculation and vacancy tax declaration letters.

Over the coming weeks, the Province will mail instructions to residential property owners in applicable areas on how to complete their declaration before the **March 31, 2026**, deadline.

In accordance with the [Village of Lions Bay Trees, Views, and Landscapes Bylaw No. 393](#), 2007, the cutting of trees on Municipal Property during active bird nesting season, which is between **March 26th and August 16th** each year, is prohibited.

If you want to do some tree work and those trees are on Municipal property, you'll need to apply for a tree cutting permit to obtain Council approval. The **March 3rd Council meeting** is the last meeting you can get your application approved so that your work can happen before the March 26th deadline - after that, you're going to have to wait until mid-August unless you get Council dispensation to undertake a nesting survey with a registered biologist at your cost to establish there are no bird nests in the vicinity of the trees you wish to cut.

Skip the rush and submit your application As Soon As Possible! Here's what needs to happen:

1. Your application needs to be completed and turned in no later than **January 30th** at **4:00 PM**.
2. Public Works will need to assess the trees so the trees being cut must be marked so that staff know exactly which tree(s) are being worked on.
3. For the Tree Committee to meet, notice must be made in the Village Update 8 days prior to their site meeting. Once the tree committee have made their recommendations, Office staff will prepare the application for submission to the Council agenda package.
4. If approved by Council, a permit will be provided to you once a \$500 damage deposit has been received by the Village Office, a copy of the tree cutting company's Certificate of Insurance naming the Village of Lions Bay as an additional insured for \$5 million, as well as their WorkSafe BC Certification.

There is a lot to prepare and organize and schedule - so please take note of the timeline!

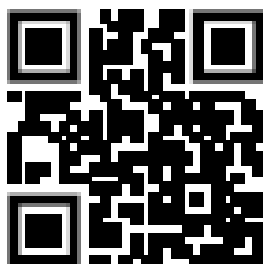
