From the Desk of Your Emergency Program Coordinator

May 3-9, 2026 is the provincial Emergency Preparedness Week. In this spirit of preparedness, there will be a test of the Alertable system on **Tuesday, May 5 at 10am**. It will also carry a message to remind us of ways that we can get ourselves ready for an emergency situation.

Alertable provides a smart alert system to notify you of significant local community emergencies with instructions on what to do and where to go in order to stay safe. It also can notify you of specific events like earthquake early warning, fire, flooding,

road closures and many other events in neighbouring communities, from advisory alerts to critical alerts that may require immediate action.

Alertable is customizable in terms of settings, locations, language and accessibility and the

type of communication device you would like the alert sent to (iOS, android and landlines). It is free to download and is used by most of the communities in BC.

Lions Bay School will be

using it in addition to emails and texts to alert parents to emergency student pickups.

Progress at the Beach Park continues to move forward, with the recent hydroseeding beginning to take effect and construction elements continuing. The grass is now starting to come in, and the site is transitioning into its final stages.

On another note, we are aware that a number of residents have been accessing the park during the construction period.

As a reminder, the Beach Park remains **fully closed to the public** at this time due to the on-going construction activity, safety hazards, the presence of equipment, and the potential for damage to newly completed works. By way of example, an area of newly hydroseeded grass was recently damaged when a dog disturbed a large area of the surface. Such repairs require additional time and cost, and may delay overall site readiness.

We appreciate the community's enthusiasm and interest in the project. However, it is important that the site remains undisturbed to ensure a safe, high-quality final outcome.

Please do not enter the park until it has been formally reopened to the public.



Calling all Lions Bay Grade 12's! The Curly Stewart Scholarship has been increased to \$2,000.

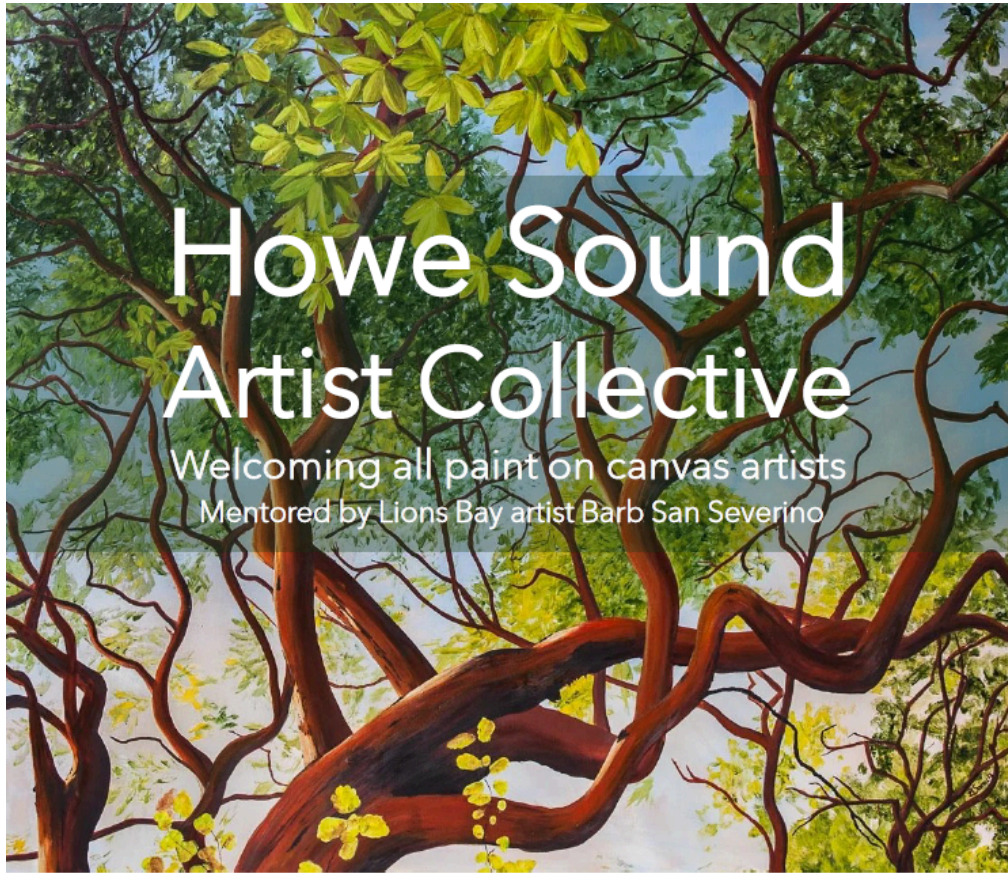
