Village of Lions Bay Announces Grand Opening of Revitalized Beach Park

Lions Bay, BC – June 19, 2026 – The Village of Lions Bay is pleased to announce the official opening of the newly revitalized Beach Park, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony scheduled for 12:00 p.m. on Canada Day, July 1, 2026.

The Beach Park revitalization project represents a significant investment in one of Lions Bay's most valued community amenities. The project includes a new washroom facility, improved accessibility, upgraded drainage and infrastructure, playground enhancements, landscaping improvements, shoreline enhancements, and other features designed to improve the functionality and enjoyment of the park for residents and visitors.

“The revitalization of this valued community space highlights what can be achieved through partnership across all levels of government,” said Christine Boyle, Minister of Housing and Municipal Affairs. *“With the project complete, the enhanced, expanded, and more accessible Beach Park is a fitting tribute to mark Lion’s Bay’s 50th anniversary—and will serve as a vibrant gathering place for families and friends for years to come.”*

Mayor Ken Berry said the completion of the project marks an important milestone for the community.

“The Beach Park has always been one of Lions Bay's most important gathering places. This project has transformed the park into a more accessible, resilient, and welcoming public space while preserving the unique character that makes it such a special destination. Council is pleased to celebrate this achievement with the community on Canada Day.”

The project was delivered through the combined efforts of Council, staff, consultants, contractors, funding partners, and community members who contributed to the planning and implementation of the improvements. Funding support for the project was provided through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program, with contributions from the federal and provincial governments, as well as local support.

“Parks are more than recreational spaces, they are where families connect, children play, and neighbours build a sense of community,” says Patrick Weiler, Member of Parliament for West Vancouver–Sunshine Coast–Sea to Sky Country. *“The revitalization of this beach park will provide residents and visitors with improved accessibility, modern amenities, and a welcoming space to enjoy the outdoors for years to come. Investments in community infrastructure like this help create inclusive, accessible spaces that strengthen our communities.”*

The ribbon-cutting ceremony will form part of the Village's Canada Day celebrations and members of the public are invited to attend.
